
## BVM History

In 1833, BVM Foundress Mary Frances Clarke journeyed from Dublin, Ireland, to Philadelphia with her four companions to answer God's call to serve the growing need for Catholic education in the immigrant church. These five Irish pioneer women began a tradition of outstanding BVM education.

Ten years later, the young community of 19 sisters migrated to Dubuque, lowa, at the invitation of Bishop Matthias Loras. The pioneer sisters, recognizing again the immense need for education, particularly of girls, established a boarding school on the prairie near Dubuque. It later became Clarke University. As the BVM community grew, the sisters staffed elementary and high schools along the upper Mississippi Valley and farther west.

In 1867, the sisters began their educational ministry in Chicago in elementary schools, high schools, and later Mundelein College. From Chicago, the BVM community expanded to the west coast and other locations in the midwest, south and east. After World War II, missions were established in Hawaii. In 1961, in response to a papal invitation, BVMs began ministering in Latin America.

Since the beginning, nearly 5,000 women have followed in the footsteps of Mary Frances Clarke to serve God's people.

Responding to the changing vision of the Catholic Church and the increasing needs of God's people, the BVM community continues to carry out the mission of Jesus through their core values of freedom, education, charity and justice.

A key aspect of BVM spirituality is being open to the new ways in which God invites us individually and as a community to respond to the needs of the times. Grounded in a life of prayer, BVMs seek to live out the Gospel values of compassion, mercy, inclusivity and justice through their diverse ministries.

Many BVM ministries are rooted in the community's long-standing tradition of education. Sisters continue to teach, tutor, direct religious education programs, and mentor students who are learning English.

Besides education, sisters are pastoral ministers, counselors, and advocates for the elderly and immigrants. Others minister in social services and healthcare. They are committed to working with organizations and groups who share BVM vision and values, striving for justice and care for the Earth.

For the past 180 years, BVMs have been inspired to seek out and respond to those in need, especially women and children. Guided by their *Constitutions*, BVM sisters are willing to go wherever the critical human need is the greatest. Learning about other cultures and values enriches the lives of the sisters, expanding relationships. Currently BVMs minister in 22 states and in Ecuador, Guatemala and Ghana.

When retired, sisters continue to live life to the fullest. Many remain in their local communities to serve. Other sisters, who are no longer able to participate in active ministry, are involved in the ministry of prayer.
